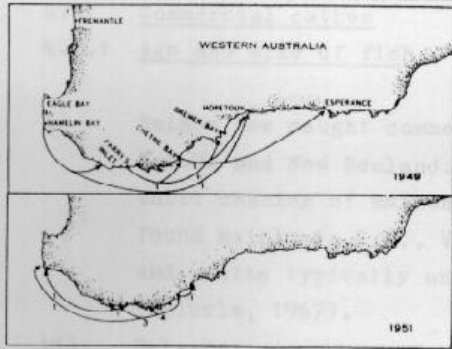
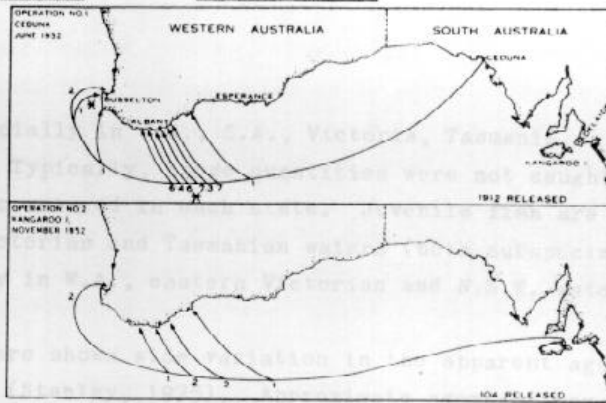


Australian Salmon - Some Tagging Results

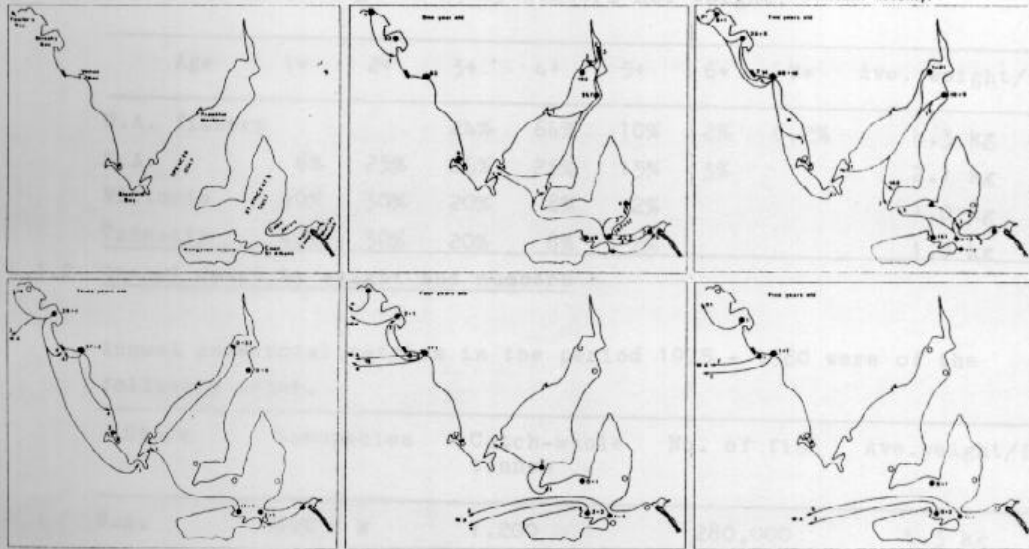


Movements of Australian salmon tagged in Western Australia. Top, post-spawning movements in 1949. Below, prespawning movements in 1951.



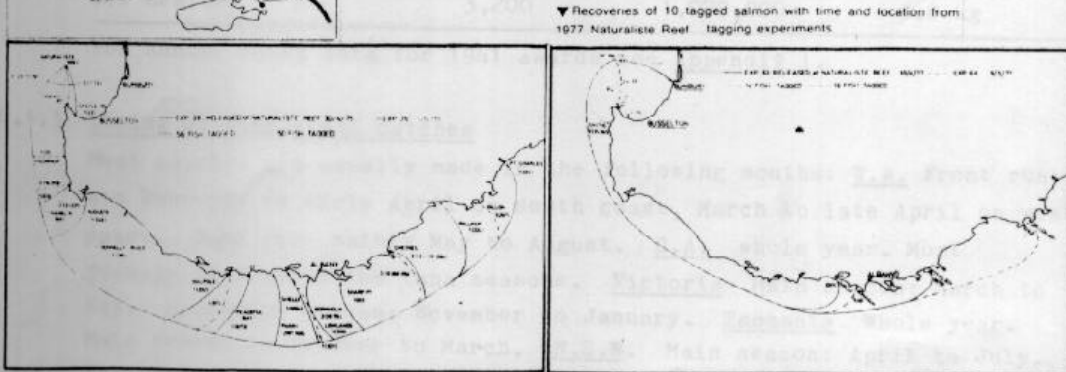
Migration of tagged fish from South Australia to Western Australia. Numbers denote recaptures from each locality.

These maps show movements of tagged salmon from release sites in successive years of their life. The numbers beside each site (solid circles) indicate the number of fish recaptured in the immediate area and in unknown areas of South Australia; for instance 15+1 means that 15 fish were recaptured around the release site and one was recaptured in an unknown locality. The figures beside the arrow heads indicate the number of fish recaptured at the position of that arrowhead, and their origin site traced back via the solid lines. Open circles indicate that no recaptures have yet been made from that release site at that age.
